<p>LibCast Opening Title Slide</p>	<p>The JSTOR database is a great resource for finding articles related to architecture and planning.</p> <p>This database covers hundreds of journal titles, back files from 41 academic disciplines and is a unique digital archive of material from the 1800's onwards.</p> <p>This LibCast will take you through some of the basic features of JSTOR.</p>
<p>Click on advanced search and display search options. Select discipline area. Type in Row houses and England. Click Search</p>	<p>JSTOR has both basic and advanced search features. Click on the advanced search link below the search box.</p> <p>If you scroll down you can see that JSTOR allows you to limit your search by Type, Date Range, and Language.</p> <p>You can also select one of the subject areas below to ensure your search retrieves relevant results.</p> <p>Let's select "Architecture & Architectural History" and "Art & Art History" and we'll search for "Row Houses" in "England".</p>
<p>Click title of an article Click on Jstor images Click on image</p>	<p>To view an article from the resource list click on the title of the document.</p> <p>In the right hand corner there is the option to save and print this article.</p> <p>There is also a tab for relevant images in both JSTOR and ARTstor. ARTstor is an image database that stores 1000's of images, drawings, and sketches relevant to architecture and planning.</p> <p>To view an image click on the image in JSTOR images or ARTstor images to view the file.</p>
<p>Click Browse tab Click on each browse option tab</p>	<p>The BROWSE tab allows you to search through all the titles in JSTOR by Discipline, Title, or Publisher. This feature allows you to browse subject areas that are relevant to your research topic.</p>
<p>Click MyJstor tab Click Register</p>	<p>You can also create a JSTOR account by clicking on the MyJSTOR tab.</p>

	<p>MyJSTOR allows you to save your search history and store relevant citations.</p> <p>If you do not have an account click on the "Register" link and fill out the required information.</p>
