Title: Navigating the Prowler Results Page
Content: From a Prowler search, the libcast outlines how to access articles, how to sort the articles, and how to refine the search

Prowler Results Page	After you have conducted a successful search in Prowler, and you have a list of articles, you will want to familiarize yourself with the way that prowler displays its records as well as some of the more specific features on the results page.
Hold mouse over "abstract" and click. Zoom in on the abstract after it pops up.	Prowler is a search engine that searches and retrieves articles from a number of different databases. Here we have a list of articles about the 2008 Olympics in Beijing. If it is available, the abstract will give you a brief summary of the article's content.
Hold mouse over title. Then click. Maximize the page to show the full text of the article.	Clicking on the article's title will take you to the database's record of the item; if the full text is available, it will either take you directly to the full article or it will provide the full-text link. We do not, however, always have full access to the articles.
Hold mouse over Get it @ Dal button. Click and maximize screen	Clicking on the Get it @ Dal link will show you Dalhousie's access options for the selected article. For an overview of these options, please view our Get it @ Dal libcast
Hold mouse over database. Click and maximize screen to show the default search screen.	Clicking on the source will take you into the database that indexes the article. The link does not take you directly to the article, but simply opens the database. Databases provide more advanced search features, and searching directly in a database generally produces more relevant results.
Hold mouse over "show in clusters." And click for clustered results.	Prowler also provides a number of options for refining your search. Clicking on the "show in clusters" option will sort your results by subject. It will pull out and list all of the articles that fall under the same topic as the selected article..
Zoom in on top left side of screen to topics and clustered results.	Another way to sort your articles is to click on one of the topics in the top left-hand side of the screen. Here your results have been categorized into different topics and sub-topics, which you can select.
Pan out from topics and zoom into "sort by database." Hold mouse over a database and click.	Just below the topics are your results categorized by database, including the number of results for each one. If we choose Abi Inform Global, Prowler will display all of the results from that database.
Return to results page.	Prowler is a useful tool to begin a general search. It provides a great starting point that can also lead you to more relevant topics and databases.
