<p>Title: Prowler – Searching a Topic Content: basic keyword search, Get it @ Dal, full-text</p>

Title page	
Homepage	You have to check out this terrific tool called Prowler. It helps you when you need to find journal articles on a topic but don't know which databases to use.
Zoom on Prowler; select	You can access Prowler from the library's homepage
Prowler homepage	There is a search box and a list of subject categories.
Zoom	Each category searches a pre-selected set of databases
Zoom on environment	For example, if you were looking for articles on "tidal power", you should select the "environmental studies" category.
Search box	And then type in your keywords, in this case "tidal power". It is recommended to search for the keywords in the title. Then click "Search"
Searching	Prowler then searches through the pre-selected databases and shows how many articles match the topic in each database.
Results	Then it displays a combined list of the results in no particular order.
Scroll results; zoom; highlight database	This article is titled "Generating Power from Tidal Currents" The author, journal title, date and pages are listed as well as the database it was found in.
Zoom on Get it @ dal	You can click on "Get it @ Dal" to find out if we have the article.
SFX screen	In this case, we have the article online from 2 different sources.
Zoom on online	You would click on "Go" to access the full-text of the article.
Article screen	First we see an abstract describing the article.
Zoom on pdf	We then click on "pdf" to get the full-text.
