<p>Fade into an image of the front entrance of the library</p>	<p>Welcome to the Sexton Library, where you will find engineering, architecture and planning resources. The Sexton Library is a great place to come to if you are interested in design and technology or just looking for a great environment to work and study in downtown.</p> <p>This LibCast will take you on a tour of the Library layout and introduce you to the services that we have to offer.</p>
<p>Zoom in on the reference desk and photocopier (circle photocopier)</p>	<p>The Circulation Desk is found to the left of the main entrance. This is where you can sign out and return books, and find items that are on reserve.</p> <p>The Reference Desk is located in the main library entrance. Staff here are happy to answer any questions that you may have regarding your research.</p> <p>To the left of this desk is a photocopier which can be used by swiping your Dal Card. There are also two other photocopiers in the hall outside the library that accept Dal Card and coins.</p>
<p>Enter the library stacks through the doors and turn left. Use a screen capture to show the monographs and lab computers (arrow to show direction of monographs from start to finish, circle scanner)</p>	<p>Our borrowing collection contains books that are arranged by subject. The lab computers are found next to the windows. There is also a double-sided printer and a scanner available for use in this lab.</p>
<p>Turn to show the stacks that contain reference, standards, and theses. (Circle each shelf label)</p>	<p>These shelves contain the Library's reference, standards, and theses collections.</p>
<p>Show a capture of the lower level journals (arrow to show direction of journals)</p>	<p>The journals are organized alphabetically by title. They start on the first floor from A to G,</p>
<p>Walk up the near set of stairs next to the elevator</p>	
<p>Turn left and create a screen capture of the upper level journals and quiet study area (arrow to show direction of journals)</p>	<p>and continue on the upper floor, from H to Z. There are also study carrels next to the journals on the upper floor for quiet study or reading.</p>
<p>Turn to the other side of the upper floor to capture the lounge area</p>	<p>The Library also has a lounge area on the upper floor that can be used for quiet reading, relaxing or group study work.</p>
<p>Continue forward to show</p>	<p>The reading room contains tables for group or quiet study and also houses</p>

the reading room and more computers	our current print journal and magazine collection.
Turn camera to show reading room computers	You will also find additional computer work stations in this area.
Walk down far set of stairs	
Back in the main Library entrance, screen capture for the circulation desk.	Now that you have had a tour of the Library be sure to activate your Dal Card at the Circulation Desk so that you have access to the resources available at the Dalhousie Libraries.
